Educational standards and facilities

Boarding

Harlin House is Brisbane Grammar School's boarding house. We provide a familylike experience for our boarders, with some of our key staff and their families living on site.

Harlin House provides a caring environment – small enough so we can get to know our students and parents well, but big enough for our boarders to have their own special group of friends. House tutors, staff and their families create a happy, safe and relaxed environment for boarders – one that reflects the patterns and rhythms of life at home.

The house represents the real diversity of Brisbane Grammar – we have boarders from all around the world as well as boys from outback Queensland and weekly boarders from Brisbane.

The life of a BGS boarder is rich with activity, with lots of opportunities to engage and connect, both inside the school and out in the wider community.

There's always something to look forward to - like social events with girls' schools, visits to the homes of day students, as well as many cultural and sporting events.

Within the school, football, chess, music and basketball are popular pastimes. Outside the school, many of our boarders join local clubs where they can pursue their special interests; for example table tennis or martial arts. The school can organise transport to these outside activities.

Our formal Activities Program operates seven days a week. It's designed to complement the day-to-day learning of the classroom with a range of interesting activities, including some uniquely Queensland experiences.

Through this program, students enjoy visiting our local theme parks and beaches, as well as excursions to Queensland's world class cultural precinct at Southbank.
